1. Works of Classic Fiction

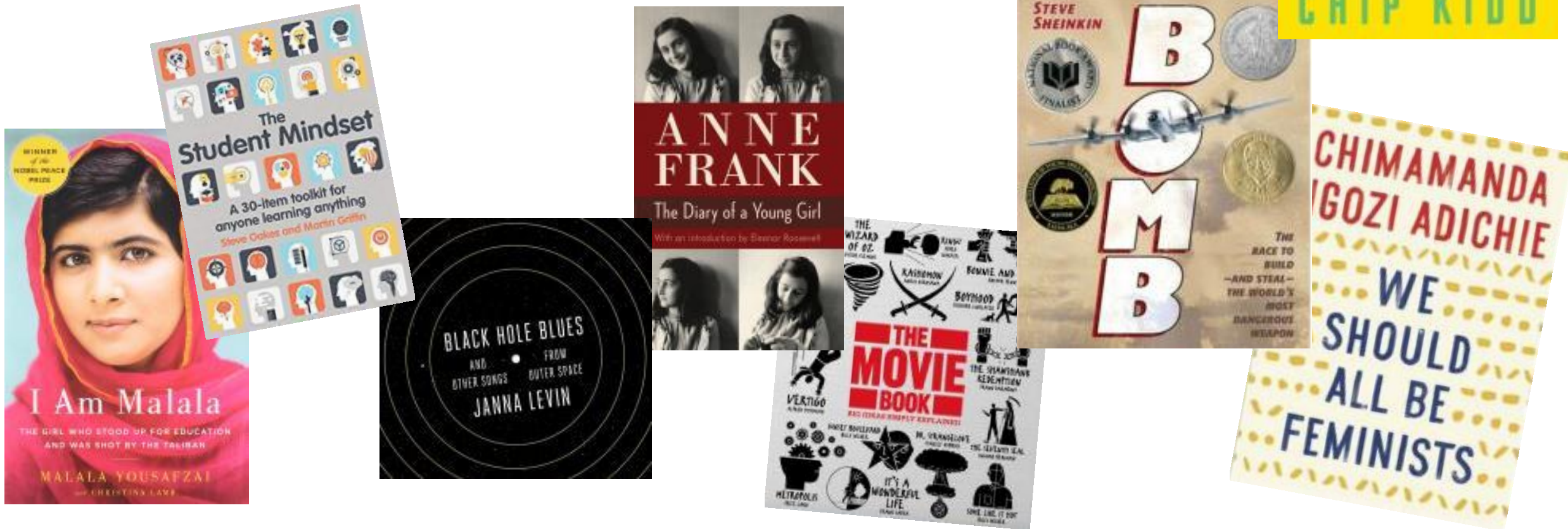
These are iconic and important works of English Literature and will challenge your reading, as well as enhance your cultural knowledge.

Non-fiction doesn't just mean a book of facts. These books can also help you to engage in some of your other interests too. Here are some current best-sellers amongst teens:



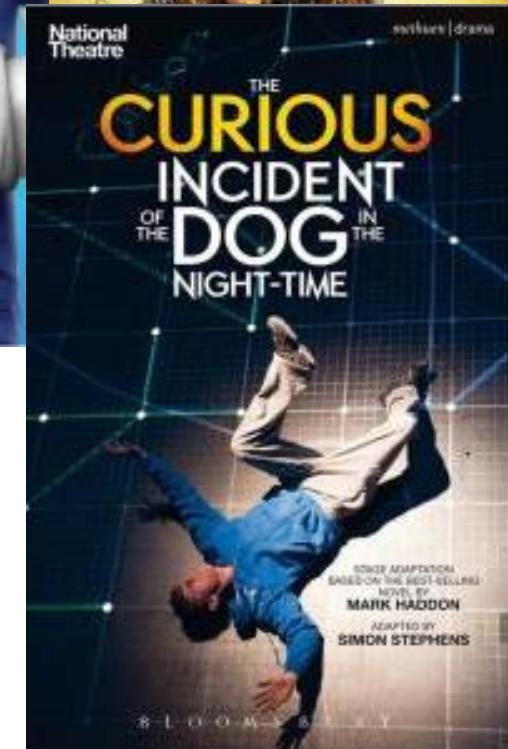
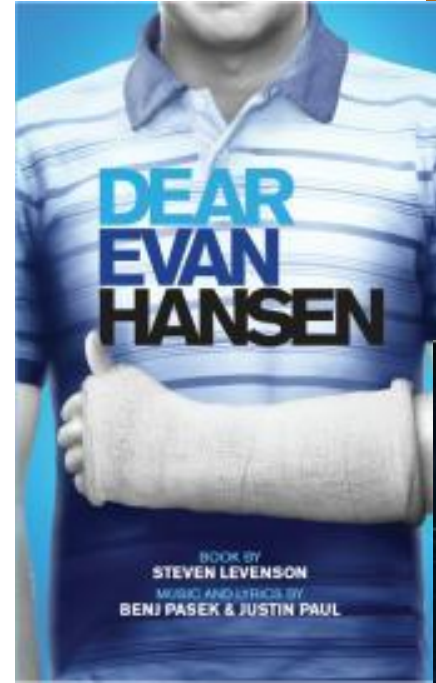
3. Poetry Collections
